Pesach: Redemption and Legacy

Soon, we will be gathering around our Seder tables to re-enact the Exodus from Egypt and to discuss its meaning for how we live our lives. Jewish tradition asserts that our ancestors were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt, and Moses (with ever present help from God) led us to freedom. The Seder depicts the story in a broad way, through various symbols and Midrashim. The purpose of the Hagaddah is not simply to present our redemption from Egyptian bondage as a singular event in time, but to inspire us to use our history to embrace a worldview of working toward the completion of redemption. The Seder is not a nostalgic reminiscence; it is an aspirational confirmation. "This year we are still here – next year, in the land of Israel. This year we are still slaves – next year, free people."

We re-enact the Exodus from Egypt because our tradition infuses us with the ideal of being in partnership with God. We see the experience of our journey to redemption as a paradigm of the human journey toward redemption, of making a Godly world. Our ancestors travelled from Egypt to the Promised Land, from slavery to freedom, from despair to hope, from the world that is to a world that might yet be. We are still travelling that path; we are still on that journey. The promise may be inspired by God, but if it is to be realized, it will be achieved by us. The strength of our tradition is not belief in a magical God who hears our plea and solves our problems. The power of our tradition is that it recognizes human consciousness (divine revelation in the human soul) as the indwelling of God in humanity. That consciousness raises us above mere survival to a concern for the collective of God's creation. It is our God given responsibility to leave behind a legacy.

It is fitting that as we approach Pesach our thoughts turn to a hoped for future. When the Israelites crossed the Red Sea, the hope of their Promised Land was a distant dream. Indeed, those who left Egypt never crossed into the Holy Land. It was their children who entered with Joshua. It reminds us that we must look to the future and provide for those who come after us.

Here at Beth Israel, we are likewise looking to the future. We are joining with our entire Jewish community, partnering with the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, and beginning a Life and Legacy program. Such Legacy conversations, between members, enable us to share our Beth Israel memories, to acknowledge the value, importance and sacredness of Beth Israel in our lives, and safeguard its future by enabling it to play the same role in the lives of those who will come after us. Over the next few years, we will be having Legacy conversations with as many of you as we can. Let us share our memories; let us aspire to a sacred and brighter tomorrow.

What's a Seder?

The seder, a festive holiday meal, actually means "order." It is called this because the meal is done in a certain order which takes us from slavery to freedom. The Haggadah - which means "the telling" - is the book used at the Passover seder. The Haggadah explains [the foods on the seder plate](#), recounts the highlights of the Exodus, and [includes songs](#), prayers, questions and vignettes.



Six Parts of the Seder Plate

Beitzah: The **Roasted Egg** is symbolic of the festival sacrifice made in biblical times. It is also a symbol of spring - the season in which Passover is always celebrated.

Chazeret: **Lettuce** is often used in addition to the maroras a bitter herb. The authorities are divided on the requirement of chazeret, so not all communities use it. Since the commandment (in Numbers 9:11) to eat the paschal lamb "with unleavened bread and bitter herbs" uses the plural ("bitter herbs") most seder plates have a place for *chazeret*.

Zeroa: The **Shankbone** is symbolic of the Paschal lamb offered as the Passover sacrifice in biblical times. Some communities use a chicken neck as a substitute. Vegetarian households may use beets.

Charoset: **Apple, nuts, and spices** ground together and mixed with wine are symbolic of the mortar used by Hebrew slaves to build Egyptian structures. There are several variations in the recipe for charoset. The Mishna describes a mixture of fruits, nuts, and vinegar.

Karpas: **Parsley** is dipped into salt water during the seder. The salt water serves as a reminder of the tears shed during Egyptian slavery. The dipping of a vegetable as an appetizer is said to reflect the influence of Greek culture.

Maror: **Bitter Herbs** (usually horseradish) symbolize the bitterness of Egyptian slavery. The maror is often dipped in charoset to reduce its sharpness. Maror is used in the seder because of the commandment (in Numbers 9:11) to eat the paschal lamb "with unleavened bread and bitter herbs".

Passover Raspberry Squares

Ingredients:

- 2 sticks margarine or butter
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 beaten eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups matzah cake meal, sifted
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 10 ounces raspberry jam
- 1 cup chopped nuts



Directions:

1. Cream together butter and sugar.
2. Add eggs, vanilla, cake meal, and salt. Mix well.
3. Divide dough in half. Spread in a 9x13 greased and floured pan.
4. Spread jam and nuts over dough. Cover with the remainder of the dough, crumbled.
5. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Cut in squares while warm.
