Adding Sacred Meditation to Yom Kippur

I am not the same man I was 30 years ago; I am not the same Jew. When I go back and read the things I wrote when I first arrived at Beth Israel, I recognize the long journey I have been on. I guess that is true of all of us. In fact, while I am a person who loves tradition and spend my days studying our ancient texts, I continue to see them through the lens of my ever evolving eyes. I have gone through my own growth, as have we all. We see the world through the collective gaze of our experiences; we are always changing, growing, learning and evolving.

Our High Holiday liturgy is designed to inspire our growth. Yom Kippur is about recognizing that we are not stuck in old patterns; we are capable of change and renewal. The language of the liturgy is sometimes couched in metaphors that no longer resonate with us the way they once did with our ancestors. The God who challenges us to become better human beings by threatening us with punishments no longer speaks to me or inspires me. The God who challenges me to endeavor for the holy, to embrace acts of sacred connection, more closely mirrors my thoughts and aspirations for the Holy Days.

We are ever striving to add inspiration, depth and meaning to our High Holy Day worship. This year we are revamping our Yom Kippur afternoon by adding a significant component to our worship. On Yom Kippur afternoon, we are inviting everyone to return to the Gusti Engelberg Sanctuary at 3:30 pm for 30 minutes of Sacred Meditation and Music. Our Cellist and Pianist will play soft and soulful meditative music while we sit in the Sanctuary and reflect on themes of ascending to Godliness and aspiring to our most pristine humanness. While you sit enveloped in the atmosphere of encountering God, we encourage you to write a little note to God. Visitors to the Western Wall often leave little notes between the stones of the Kotel, prayers to God. These prayers speak more to us than to God, but they are a point of connection. In our Gusti Engelberg Sanctuary, there will be two baskets on a small table before the open Ark. In one people can place private prayers that will not be read by anyone. They may reflect our private, inmost thoughts on the most sacred day of our year. The other basket is for people to place their hopes, aspirations and wishes for the year, for themselves and the community. These prayers will be collected and placed on a special page on our website, where we can all share in the blessings.

We are hoping that many of you will return to the Gusti Engelberg Sanctuary for this beautiful and evocative Sacred Meditation. It will segue into Yizkor, our Memorial service, and the deeply moving concluding service of Ne'ilah. After the final blast of the shofar, when Yom Kippur comes to a close, we invite the entire congregation to join us for a communal breaking of the fast. It is a wonderful time to connect with our fellow Beth Israelites, welcome the New Year and share our break fast meal in the Joseph and Esther Ashner Auditorium.

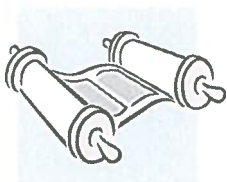
